Meeting Oregon's Greenhouse Gas Reduction Goals

The materials attached and listed below include the legislation (and the year enacted) which address greenhouse gas emission reductions and requirements for renewable energy development to replace fossil fuels.

House Bill 3543 (2007), which established Oregon's Greenhouse gas reduction goals.

Senate B 838 (2007), which established the first Renewable Portfolio Standard of 25% of all electric energy must come from qualifying renewable energy by the year 2025.

Senate Bill 101 (2009) which prohibits use of new coal plants to serve Oregon electric loads.

House Bill 2186 (2009) which establishes the low carbon fuel standard for vehicle emissions.

Senate Bill 1547 (2016) which extended and increased the Renewable Portfolio Standard for electric utilities from 25% of qualifying renewable energy in the year 2025 to 50% qualifying renewable energy by the year 2040. Senate Bill 1547 also prohibits electric utilities from serving electric load in Oregon from existing coal plants after 2030.
